In October, we again held our "Cutest Baby" fundraiser at the county fair. This is our main fundraiser for the year. There is a fee to submit the 8 x 10 photo to the competition and then attendees to the fair are allowed one vote per person to determine the cutest baby for the year. The top three in votes receive a cash prize. We had been doing savings bonds, but the regulations involved in the purchase of bonds no longer allow us to do that.

We also had 13 different sponsors who provided \$625 worth of money and services to provide a free lunch and promotion of the event.
