University in 2007 after a career of almost thirty years as the Senior Director of the Opportunity Development Center (ODC). She was responsible for all University and Medical Center matters related to equal


opportunity and affirmative action laws, regulations, and guidelines. She achieved outstanding success in the academic world and is recognized internationally as an advocate for diversity and equity.

The Official BPWTN Call to Interim Board

State Officers, Regional Directors, State Committee Chairs, Local Organization To: Presidents, Governance Chair and Immediate Past State President



By authority vested in me as President of the BUSINESS & PROFESSIONAL WOMEN OF TENNESSEE, INC. (BPW/TN), and pursuant to vote of members of the Board, a meeting of the Executive Committee and the Board of Directors is hereby called for on November 4, 2017. All Board activities are scheduled at Comfort Suites, 904 Murfreesboro Road, Lebanon, TN 37090



The following items of business will be presented for consideration and action:

- 1. Reports and recommendations from state officers, committee chairs, local organization presidents, and regional directors.
 - 2. Approval of appointment of additional committee members (Executive Committee only).
 - 3. Report of study committees, and election of nominating committee.
- 4. Such other business as may properly come before the meeting to promote the work and effectiveness of BPW/TN.

The Executive Committee will meet Friday, November 3, 2017 at 8:00p.m. Central Time in the President's Room at the Lebanon Comfort Suites. Committee chairs having recommendations are invited to attend this meeting to present their recommendations, in writing.

The Board of Directors will convene at 10:30 a.m., Central Time, on November 4, 2017. Thereafter, all meeting and functions will follow the official program, as adopted.

All members of BPW/TN may attend meetings of the Board of Directors and may discuss matters presented for action. However, the making of motions and voting are limited to the Board of Directors.

Registration fee of \$25.00 applies only to those who pre-register at least 8 days prior to the formal opening of the Board meeting. Registration fee after that time shall be \$30.00. Non-members attending only one or more stated meals shall not be required to pay a registration fee. A request for refund of paid pre-registration and stated meals may be approved only if made in writing to the President and the Interim Board Chair by the person requesting refund, received no later than 72 hours prior to the first business meeting. One-half (1/2) of only the registration fee will be approved only if made in writing to the State President and received no later than 24 hours prior to the first business meeting. Registration fees are not transferrable from one member to another unless the transfer occurs between members of the same Local Organization. Transfers within a Local Organization will be allowed without prior approval of the State President.



Legislative Platform 2017-2018

PREAMBLE

The Equal Rights Amendment, as authored by Alice Paul, shall stand first, foremost, and above all other items which may appear on the platform of this organization until equal, legal rights for women and men become guaranteed in the U. S. Constitution, because all statutory law derives from there.

THE EQUAL RIGHTS AMENDMENT

Equality of rights under the law shall not be denied or abridged by the United States or by any state on account of sex.

PLATFORM

Economic Equity

Ensure pay equity, equal educational and economic opportunities at all stages of life; and promote affordable, quality dependent care to help ensure economic self-sufficiency for women.

Health

Ensure reproductive choice and full access to all reproductive health services and education; ensure funds for research into and protections for women's health care needs; and encourage the development of a national health care plan recognizing the special health care needs of women.

Civil Rights

Ensure equal rights and remedies for women in all phases of their lives; support affirmative action; eliminate sexual harassment and violence against women.

October Women's History Events:

October 3, 1904 – Mary McLeod Bethune opens her first school for African-American students in Daytona Beach, Florida

October 4, 1976 - Barbara Walters becomes the first woman co-anchor of the evening news (at ABC)

October 4, 1993 - Ruth Bader Ginsburg joins the U.S. Supreme Court as its second woman Justice

October 8, 1993 - Toni Morrison becomes the first African American woman to win the Nobel Prize for Literature

October 10, 1983 – Dr. Barbara McClintock receives the Nobel Prize for Medicine for her discovery in genetics about mobile genetic elements

October 11, 1984 – Dr. Kathryn D. Sullivan is the first U.S. woman astronaut to "walk" in space during Challenger flight

October 15, 1948 - Dr. Frances L. Willoughby is the first woman doctor in the regular U.S. Navy

October 16, 1916 - Margaret Sanger opens the U.S.'s first birth control clinic in Brooklyn, New York

October 23, 1910 - Blanche Stuart Scott is the first American woman pilot to make a public flight

October 24, 1956 - Reverend Margaret Towner is the first woman ordained a minister in the Presbyterian Church

October 28, 1958 - Mary Roebling is the first woman director of a stock exchange (American Stock Exchange)
