Equali-Tea is a part of MTSU's Women's History Month Celebration

The organizers of the Equali-Tea announced the event is moving into March!

The hats optional high tea has traditionally been held on Equal Pay Day. According to the National Committee on Pay Equity, the next Equal Pay Day is Tuesday, March 31, 2020.

Equal Pay Day was originated by the National Committee on Pay Equity in 1996 as a public awareness event to illustrate the gap between men's and women's wages. For the past 25 years, It has been held in April but recent wage data from the US Census shows women have made gains, moving the symbolic date earlier in the year.

To bring attention to the wage gap, the 2020 Equali-Tea will be held at 4:30 PM on Wednesday March 18th in the Student Union Ballroom at Middle Tennessee State University. This event coincides with MTSU's Women's History Month programming. The theme this year is "Nevertheless She Persisted: Valiant Women of the Vote."

The High Tea is a fundraising opportunity for the Middle Tennessee Fund for Women and Girls, a nonprofit organization, that supports the mission to level the playing field for women and girls in education and the workforce. The funds raised go toward two scholarships offered to MTSU students. This event is also the stage for an annual presentation of the Tempest Award which is presented to a community leader who has worked to better the status of women and girls in Tennessee.

Valiant Women of the Vote

Valiant Women of the Vote- 2020 Women's History Month

Each year the National Women's History Alliance chooses a theme for Women's History Month and this year's theme is "Valiant Women of the Vote." This theme is to honor the brave women who fought to win the suffrage rights for women and for the women who continue to fight for the voting rights of others.

Every year March is designated as Women's History Month by a Presidential proclamation. The month is set aside to honor women's contributions in American history. Women's History Month began as a local celebration in Santa Rosa, California. The Education Task Force of the Sonoma County Commission on the Status of Women planned a "Women's History Week" in 1978. The organizers selected the week of March 8 to correspond with International Women's Day. The movement spread across the country as other communities initiated their own Women's History Week celebrations the next year.

In 1980 a group of historians and women's organizationsled by the National Women's History Project- successfully lobbied for national recognition. In February 1980, President Jimmy Carter issued a Presidential Proclamation declaring the week of March 8th, 1980 as National Women's History Week. Subsequent Presidents continued to proclaim a National Women's History Week in March until 1987. That year Congress passed Public Law 100-9 designating March as "Women's History Month." Between 1988 and 1994, Congress passed additional resolutions authorizing the President to proclaim March of each year as Women's History Month. Each President, since 1995, has issued annual proclamations designating March as "Women's History Month."

Many communities around the country plan special speaking engagements and celebrations- Is your local community doing anything special? If not, perhaps your LO would like to plan a celebration for this month or get involved with a community involvement project for next year! It's never to early to start making plans!

INTERNATIONAL WOMEN'S DAY


Harriman, Tennessee

A.R.M. was formed in 1991 at the request of the Carter County Ministerial Association to help the area churches and individuals coordinate benevolent aid for food, clothing and other resources. A.R.M. provides these resources to those in need in a non-discriminatory and equitable manner. They serve an average 650 families each month.

Elaine's first volunteer experience at A.R. M. was preparing food boxes with items donated by individuals, area churches and Second Harvest Food Bank of Northeast TN. That was over 14 years ago. Now she serves on the Board and as the Clothing Coordinator. Her job, alone with other volunteers, is to inspect donated items to make sure their clients receive good quality seasonal clothing for children and adults at no cost. Elaine says that the hours she volunteers there are very rewarding.

My love for animals has led me on a path to help save and rescue them! There are so many animals in need for numerous reasons: owner passes away, owner abandons them, or some family dynamics changebabies, college, divorce, nursing home etc. we are here to rescue them and find them the loving homes they deserve!
