Dangerous Times call for dangerous women - Pat Mitchell



Pat Mitchell has nothing left to prove and much less to lose -- she's become a "dangerous woman." Not dangerous as in feared, she says, but fearless: a force to be reckoned with. In this powerful call to action, Mitchell invites all women, men and allies to join her in embracing the risks necessary to create a world where safety, respect and truth burn brighter than the darkness of our current times.

At every step of her career, Pat Mitchell has broken new ground for women, leveraging the power of media as a journalist, an Emmy award-winning and Oscar-nominated producer to tell women's stories and increase the representation of women onscreen and off. Transitioning to an executive role, she became the president of CNN Productions and the first woman president and CEO of PBS and the Paley Center for Media. Today, her commitment to connect and strengthen a global community of women leaders continues as a conference curator, advisor and mentor.



Observed and Celebrated: The third Monday in January. Born on January 15, 1929, Martin Luther King Jr. grew to become one of the greatest Social Activists the world has ever known. At 35, he became the youngest person to win the Nobel Peace prize. He was assassinated on April 4, 1968 while making a speech from the balcony of his hotel room in Memphis, Tennessee. His birthday became a National Holiday by an act of Congress in 1983. Many consider it a day to serve your community.

January Women's Moments in History

January 5, 1925 – Nellie Tayloe Ross is inaugurated as the first woman Governor in U.S. history (Governor of Wyoming)

January 7, 1896– Fanny Farmer's first cookbook is published in which she standardized cooking measurements January 7, 1955—Marian Anderson is the first African American woman to sing at the Metropolitan Opera

January 8, 1977– Pauli Murray is ordained as the first female African American Episcopal priest

January 11, 1935– Amelia Earhart makes the first solo flight from Hawaii to North America

January 12, 1932– Hattie Wyatt Caraway (D-Arkansas) is the first woman elected to the U.S. Senate, becomes the first woman to chair a Senate Committee and the first to serve as the Senate's presiding officer
January 25, 1980– Mary Decker became the first woman to run a mile under 4 1/2 minutes, running it at 4:17.55
January 29, 1926– Violette Neatly Anderson is the first black woman to practice law before the U.S. Supreme Court


