Jane is a founding partner of The Ferrell McDaniel Company, an association management, grassroots advocacy and political action committee development firm.

Previously Jane served as Executive Director of CHART (Campaign for a Healthy and Responsible Tennessee), a grassroots coalition seeking to reduce the tobacco use.

She has 15 years of development experience that includes securing major gifts for the Vanderbilt University Medical Center and for Harpeth Hall School.

Her political experience includes nine years as a full-time professional at the state and national levels. She was Political Director for the Tennessee Republican Party first under the chairmanship of Tom Beasley and again in 1984 when Susan Richardson Williams served as Chairman.

During the 1982 election cycle she was Field Director at the National Republican Congressional Committee and consulted with congressional campaigns in six southern states. From 1974 to 1979 Jane worked for the Republican National Committee in the Special Projects and Education Division and then as Local Elections Director assigned to the southeast region.

Trained as microbiologist, she holds a bachelor’s degree from the Ohio State University and has never regretted her decision to leave that field and enter the world of politics.

THE SCHOLARSHIP FOR FUTURE COMMUNITY LEADERS

Endeavoring to Aid Our Future Leaders Today

Established to honor distinguished community and technical college students, The Scholarship for Future Community Leaders recognizes African American women in the middle Tennessee area who have a proven history of academic excellence and active community service.

The \$500 scholarship is available to women between 18-25 who are high school graduates. Applicants must currently be attending a community college or technical school in middle Tennessee in an academic program granting an Associates Degree or an accredited certification upon completion.

Requirements: (1) 3.0 GPA or higher, (2) must be a student in good standing in the upcoming semester/quarter or will be graduating/receiving certification in the current semester/quarter, (3) must provide written and photographic documentation of community service for at least one year prior to application submission, and (4) completion of a 500-1,000 word essay explaining how she would address a current community challenge, including stating the specific problem and outlining a plan of action.

The Tennessee Economic Council on Women's Foundation announces scholarship awards of \$1,000 will be presented to a high school senior and non-traditional student (must be out of high school for 5 years and not completed higher education degree) in each grand division of the state!

Scholarship selection will be based on the following criteria:

- Record of academic achievement both in high school and college entrance exams,
- Participation and leadership demonstrated in school activities,
- Participation in community activities and/or girl scout activities, and
- Quality of letters of recommendations.

Applications must be completed online by deadline which is September 28, 2012. The application and instructions are on the Foundation website,

www.womenseconomicfoundation.org. The successful applicant must be able to attend the presentation ceremony in Nashville on October 22, 2012.

September Highlights in US Women's History

- **Sept. 2, 2008**—Janice Holder of Memphis is sworn in as the first female Chief of the TN Supreme Court
- **Sept. 12, 1910** – Alice Stebbins Wells, a former social worker becomes the first woman police officer in US (Los Angeles, CA)
- **Sept. 7, 1960** – In the 1960 Summer Olympic Games in Rome, Italy, Wilma Rudolph became the first American woman to win three gold medals in track and field during a single Olympic Games. She also set two world records in running. In 1980, she was named to the Women’s Sports Hall of Fame, the first black woman to receive that honor.
- **Sept. 4, 1963** – Harvard Business School starts accepting women
- **Sept. 14, 1964** – Helen Keller receives the Presidential Medal of Freedom along with 4 other women including Dr. Lena Edwards, Lynn Fontanne, Dr. Helen Taussig, and Leontyne Price
- **Sept 14, 1975** - Elizabeth Ann Seton is canonized. She is the first American-born saint, and founded the first U.S. Order of Sisters of Charity of St. Joseph
- **Sept. 20, 1973** – Billie Jean King defeats Bobby “No broad can beat me” Riggs in battle of the sexes tennis match.
- **Sept. 25, 1981** – Sandra Day O’Connor is sworn in as the first woman Supreme Court justice in the court’s 191-year history
- **Sept. 26, 1971**– Rep. Shirley Chisholm(D-New York) announces she will enter the Democratic Presidential primaries
- **Sept 26, 1973** - Capt. Lorraine Potter, an American Baptist minister, is the first woman U.S. Air Force chaplain
- **Sept 29, 1988** - Stacy Allison becomes first U.S. woman to reach the summit of Mt. Everest

- **Sept 1, 1933 (2006)** - Ann Richards, second woman elected governor of Texas (1990)
- **Sept 2, 1948 (1986)** - Christa McAuliffe, NH teacher, selected in 1985 to be the first teacher in space; died aboard space shuttle Challenger
- **Sept 3, 1920 (1966)** - Marguerite Higgins, first woman to win Pulitzer Prize for International Reporting (1951) for coverage of the Korean War
- **Sept 6, 1860 (1935)** - Jane Addams, founder of Hull House in Chicago, first major settlement house. First American woman to receive Nobel Peace Prize (1931); helped establish American Civil Liberties Union (1920)
- **Sept 8, 1859 (1918)** - Mary M. Kimball Kehew, union organizer, cofounder of the Union for Industrial Progress (1892); first president of National Women's Trade Union League (1903)
- **Sept 14, 1830 (1910)** - Emily Edson Briggs, first woman White House correspondent, during Lincoln's administration; first president of Women's National Press Assn. (1882)
- **Sept 14, 1879 (1966)** - Margaret Sanger, pioneer in birth control and sex education; founded predecessor to Planned Parenthood
- **Sept 18, 1905 (1993)** - Agnes De Mille, dancer, choreographer, pioneer of the American Ballet Theater
- **Sept 20, 1946** - Judith Baca, Latina visual artist and muralist; community activist.
- **Sept 23, 1863 (1954)** - Mary Church Terrell, first president of National Assn. of Colored Women (1896); picketed in Washington DC for suffrage and desegregation
- **Sept 23, 1838 (1927)** - Victoria Woodhull, feminist, first woman candidate for U.S. President (1872) for the Equal Rights Party; with sister, first women to be members of the NY Stock Exchange (1870's)

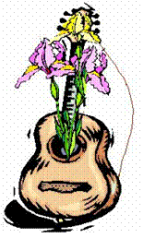
